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1.0. PLATFORM for the NEEDY (PLANE) PROJECT BACKGROUND

PLATFORM for the NEEDY (PLANE) is a Non-Governmental Organization, NOT for profit operating in the Kabarole district, Rwenzori region, advocating and protecting children and women's rights through provision of prevention and multi-disciplinary intervention in investigation and information dissemination through radio drama and outreaches to have a health -violence free society.

The organization helps transform the lives of the disadvantaged populations in Kabarole district and Fort Portal Tourism City, Rwenzori region, Western Uganda through empowerment programs, human rights advocacy, and health and literacy promotion so that they can have a better quality of life. PLANE focuses on general health awareness promotion, social security, and economic empowerment for teenage mothers, preventing violence against children and women, human rights promotion, and mitigating the impact of violence against children and the youth and other related interventions.

PLANE implements programs aimed at educational support to orphans and vulnerable children by providing scholastic materials and school fees. We also implements programs for empowering young mothers and rural women through livelihood interventions. In addition, we greatly support intervention on Gender-Based Violence prevention, sexual reproductive health rights, environment conservation and protection, water, sanitation and hygiene for rural communities. Founded in 2010 PLANE is registered with the Uganda National NGO Board No. 10895. The organization has developed potential capacity and recognition in enhancing Health promotion Programs, advocacy for the protection of children's rights with emphasis on girl child education, Youth and Teenage Mothers Empowerment, caring and improving lives of vulnerable children and ensuring a well-equipped and knowledgeable farming community.

1.1. Legal Status & Registration:

PLATFORM for the NEEDY is responding call for expression of interest to advocate for the protection of children's rights, to help meet their basic needs and to expand their opportunities to reach their full potential. PLATFORM for the NEEDY (PLANE) is one of the national charity agencies in the country operating in Ruwenzori region set up in 2011 and registered at the national level (under NGO Bureau) in 2014 operating under the NGO Act of 2006. PLANE is member of Girls not Bride Uganda (GNBU) alliance a fraternity that is focused at fighting teenage pregnancy and early marriages in Uganda.

The Initiative is an incorporated charitable entity based in Uganda in East Africa.

Primarily PLANE is into charitable work mainly children and women rights protection and SGBV prevention, Educational support. HIV prevention and Sexual Reproductive Health, Livelihood and economic empowerment, Environmental conservation and Water, sanitation and hygiene.

PLANE is run by a group of professionals dedicated to support the underserved and vulnerable populations. PLANE has a dedicated board of 7 members and 5 Trustees supported the secretariat/management team of staff (7) and core volunteers, Global Ambassadors and other volunteers with technical expertise who support field level interventions.

1.2. Organizational Philosophy

PLANE is an organization built on the philosophy of unity in diversity for advocacy on the rights of children and women.

2.0. PLANE ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION EDUCATION PROGRAM

School-going children are never too young to start learning about trees and forests. This enables pupils and students to love and connect with nature and fosters future generations that are conscious of the benefits of trees and forests and the need to manage them sustainably.

Under the Environmental Conservation Education program, PLANE encourages and **supports young generations to love forests and to take care of trees** around them to improve the environment for posterity.

Environmental Conservation Education is crucial to prevent environmental degradation and sensitize society towards a more sustainable lifestyle.

We believe that **investing in children's forestry education** can change the world for the better and we ensure that local communities work to reduce deforestation and restore degraded landscapes.

PLANE is committed to working closely with schools to train teachers and students on forest plantation establishment and maintenance, especially tree planting for fuel wood, agroforestry, planting of fruit trees like mangoes, guavas, oranges, jack fruits, apples, paw paws, avocados among others to provide nutrients to children and also conserve the environment.

The Environmental Conservation Education Programme is reaching out to children and young people to encourage them to care for their environment. More than 50% of Uganda's population is below 15 years of age, so PLANE activities are intentionally implemented in primary and secondary schools, communities, and churches as a way of targeting the youth to encourage environmental learning through participation. We aim at raising awareness about using nature to increase production and conserve the environment.

With your contribution, you can help PLATFORM for the NEEDY achieve the following in the area of environmental conservation:

- \$0.5 Buys native tree seedlings to reduce soil erosion.
- \$2 purchases a fruit tree for schools
- •\$200 enables training on environment conservation in 5 schools
- \$400 will enable the purchase and distribution of tree seedlings in 5 schools
- \$500 will enable 30 farmers to receive training on better methods.
- \$200 will enable 20 people to receive training in briquette making.
- •\$400 enables 50 homes to receive tree seedlings
- \$200 will enable 10 people to receive training on energy-saving stoves..
- \$5000 will enable us to acquire a piece of land for a nursery bed

• \$300 will support a drama community outreach performance sensitization on environment conservation.

Out of the planned \$10,000, the fundraiser was able to raise \$1000 only to help in greening Uganda schools. The initial plan was to cover 70 primary schools, 20 secondary and 30 communities in Kabarole and Bunyangabu districts and Fort Portal Tourism City but the funds could not permit. We only covered 15 primary schools. We purchased these species of trees that include Croton, Terminalia, and guavas for school compound and Grevelia for school boundaries.

2.2. AIM OF THE CAMPAIGN:

- To educate children about trees and forests to love and connect with nature and fosters future generations that are conscious of the benefits of trees and forests and the need to manage them sustainably.
- To reach out to children in primary and secondary schools and young people to encourage them to care for their environment hence mitigating the effects of climate change.
- To support the 70 primary schools, 20

secondary schools and 30 communities plant trees and green their communities.

• To work closely with schools to train teachers and students on tree nursery and tree plantation establishment and maintenance, and establishment of the School Environment Clubs

2.3. PLANNED ACTIVITIES

- Identify schools to benefit from the Greening Uganda Schools.
- Mobilize resources and fundraise to raise \$10,000 to support schoolchildren and youth in communities in greening their communities.
- Design communication materials to help disseminate the environmental conservation and protection issues to the children.
- Purchase tree seedlings and distribute them to the selected schools.
- Orientation of the head teachers, teachers, children and students about the project and the sponsors and their continued support to the project.
- Training of teachers about the project and establishment of the School Environment Clubs for sustainability purposes.
- Hold meetings with the sponsors to brief them about the progress of the project.
- To meet the sponsors Manav Gupta and Toby Leng to be PLANE Ambassadors in

New York and USA atlarge to always mobilize resources, source potential partners and fundraise for the sustainability of this project.

• To prepare and share the report with the sponsors.

• Provide video documentary of the beneficiaries talking about the project impact.

• Monitor the environment clubs and assess the progress of the project in schools.

• Provide the funders with accountabilities.

2.4. PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS

- PLANE reached out 15 primary schools out of the 70 targeted
- Tree seedlings were purchased and distributed to 15 schools

• Hired a vehicle for the transportation of the trees and staff.

- Established environmental friends school clubs and identified teachers to be in charge.
- Video documentary about the project done and uploaded on the YouTube and shared with funders.
- Bought T-shirts for the project.
- Project banner was produced for brand awareness.
- Designed and printed ply cards with Environment conservation issues for children to read.

• Talked to Manav and Toby to advocate for the sustainability of the project, look for partners and funders of the project.

3. LESSONS LEARNT

- Many schools wanted tree seedlings but access has been a problem
- The school administrators and children welcomed the project and were excited to have trees for the first time.

• Teachers also wanted the project to benefit them.

• Teachers wanted to be given tree seedlings at least 10 each for their families.

• Children demanded that they should be given trees for planting at home.

• The schools demanded for more tree seedlings to cover all the areas around their schools.

• Environmental clubs were not inexistence.

• For sustainability purposes there is need for monitoring the beneficiary schools

• Head teachers revealed that when the community is not given trees , they will still theirs

- Communities need to be given trees.
- Found out that most schools have areas for tree planting.

- The tree seedlings were not enough to cover all the targeted schools.
- We were overwhelmed by the number of children who approached us seeking for assistance in terms of fees and scholastic materials.

• Teachers also asked us to help some needy bright children who face difficulties with fees, uniform and lunch.

3.2 CHALLENGES

- Out of the 70 primary schools we had targeted to start with, we only reached out
 15. This was because the funds could not allow.
- We had planned to start with 20 secondary schools and 30 communities but none was reached out because the funds were not enough.
- Our goal was to raise \$10,000 for kick

4.0 FUTURE PLANS:

• We plan to meet our brothers Manav and Toby to discuss on how best this project can be rolled out to other schools and to the communities so that people understand issues of environment conservation and protection.

• We plan to ask Manav and Toby to recruit youth adolescent youth and adults as volunteers and ambassadors that can spread the message of environment conservation, lobby and advocate for funding for the sustainability of the project.

• Write concepts and proposals on environment conservation and submit to our volunteers to lobby for partners and funders.

• Plan to establish debating competitions in schools that will be focusing on environment issues. The winning children and schools will be given a prize. We believe this motivates both the children and teachers and will grow with the spirit of conserving nature.

• We plan to request the initiators of the project to do these fundraisers at least half a year and annually for the project not to die out.

• Plan to establish nursery beds at schools, children look after them and tree seedlings will be given to children to take home for planting.

• Want to expand our partnerships with the USA community and other countries.

• We plan to invite our friends to visit Uganda to assess the progress of the project and also interact with the project beneficiaries. This gives them a clear picture of the environment here in Uganda and it strengthens the relationship.

They welcomed the project and said it was their first time to receive organizations to give them trees for planting and this would beautify their compounds and also the fruits improve on their nutrition. The Executive Director PLANE asked the children to take care of the trees and look after them.

With the passion, commitment and intensified resource mobilization by our global ambassadors and volunteers, PLANE hopes to scale up the number of benefiting schools and communities for sustainability of this project.
